

Community Development Block Grant-Recovery Housing (CBDG-RHP)
Collaboration: City of Jackson-Pathways Behavioral Health Services
A Summary

The Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development (TNECD) in partnership with Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (TMHSAS) is offering funding for addiction recovery housing. Applicants are required to be city or county governments, partnering with substance abuse recovery service providers. Applications must range between \$250,000 and \$750,000, and serve adults with low, moderate incomes. Homeless served in the housing must be in recovery.

This proposal is for the City of Jackson to partner with Pathways Behavioral Health Services to submit an application for three activities:

1. Renovate three-bedroom 427 Preston Street-currently own by the City of Jackson and used by Pathways for recovery housing-estimated cost \$25,000
2. Renovate 4 bedroom 527 Berry Street-currently owned by the City of Jackson and used by Pathways for recovery housing-estimated cost \$25,000
3. Construct new recovery housing on lot owned by Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) and deeded to the City-3-4 bedrooms-estimated cost \$650,000-\$700,000. Pathways is focusing on using either 367, 369, 381, or 376 Preston Street. All are owned by the CRA. Contingent on grant approval, the CRA will deed the chosen property to the City.

The City will have a lease/operations agreement with Pathways for new buildings.

Application will be released in January 2002, with the application due in March.

Application requires a public hearing and City Council approving resolution for submittal. Public hearing can be held during the City Council meeting.
